

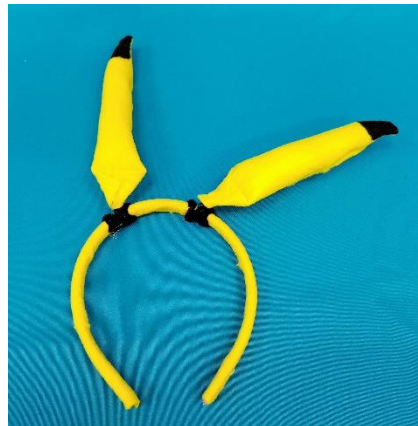

- Black paint
- Hot glue sticks (2)
- Pipe cleaners (2)
- Headband
- Polyfil
- Ear Template



### What You Need at Home

- Scissors
- Hot Glue Gun
- Black Permanent Marker

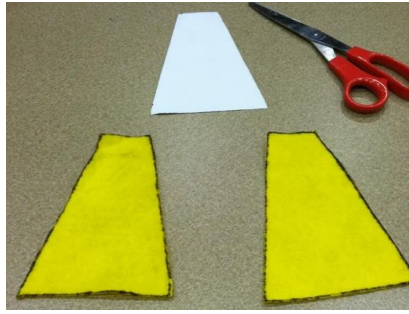

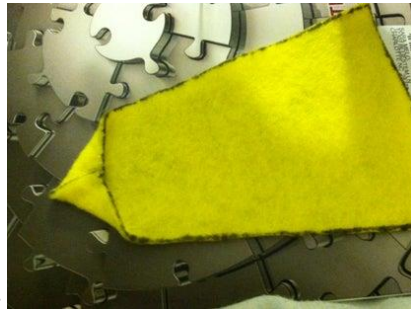
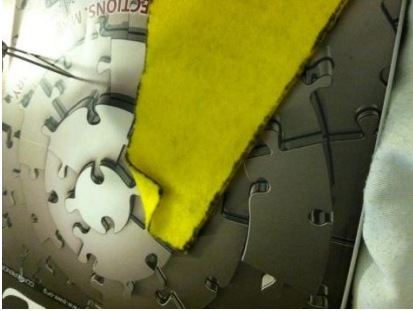
1. Cut out the template and use it to trace two pieces onto the felt with a marker; then cut out your felt.
2. Fold each corner of the smaller end of your felt pieces in, to create a point; place a dab of glue under the fold to secure the point.
3. Fold each side of felt in to create a "hollow tube" use hot glue to secure the folded pieces creating a seam. Allow to dry fully.
4. Insert the pipe cleaner so one end reaches the glued tip of the felt; a bit should stick out the bottom.
5. Glue the pipe cleaners in place by adding a dab of glue on the inside of the ears.
6. Stuff the ears with a bit of Polyfil. (**Note: Do not overstuff.**)
7. Once stuffed, press the opening together around the pipe cleaner and add glue to close it.
8. Use your headband to measure length and cut out two strips of yellow felt. These should be thick enough to wrap around the headband.
9. Wrap the felt around your headband, adding glue to secure it as you go. Allow to dry.
10. Position the ears on the headband as desired; use the pipe cleaners to wrap under and around the headband. Add hot glue for a more permanent placement.
11. Use your finger to paint the ends of the ears with the black paint. Allow to dry for an hour.

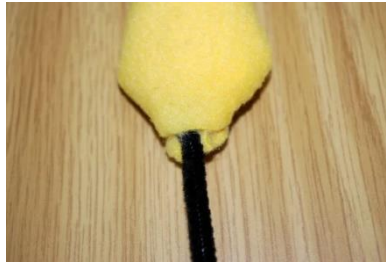

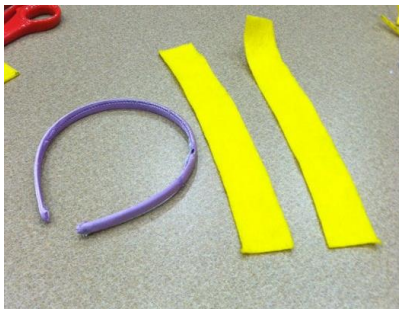
